

CAMP COMFORTS

Puckapunyal Ready

While most members of the Sixth Division occupied Puckapunyal camp under summer conditions, the Seventh Division will do its training in winter.

Troops of the Seventh who are now moving in, however, will find that all arrangements have been made for their comfort. Ample heating has been provided for the messes, recreation huts, and other buildings, and hot showers will also be available soon.

Hundreds of officers and men will enter camp to-day, and a steady intake will follow.

Under the command of Brigadier J. E. S. Stevens, Victorian troops for the division will comprise two field artillery regiments, a medium artillery regiment, the 14th Infantry Battalion (the only infantry battalion from Victoria in this division), a Pioneer Battalion, the Fifth Field Ambulance, a Divisional Supply Column, and various Corps troops.

The Pioneer Battalion will be a specialist unit. Its officers will include many civil engineers. In the ranks will be found fitters and turners, motor mechanics, and other tradesmen.
