

## PERSONAL NOTES

**LIEUT. REGINALD ROBERT ANDERSON**, 29, now reported wounded and missing, probably prisoner of war, is only son of Mr. and Mrs. P. R. Anderson, Geelong. Educated at South Melbourne IS and Melbourne TC, he was an engineering draughtsman on staff of A. Gordon Gutteridge, Hoskins and Davey, consulting engineers, and was a lieutenant in the Militia. He was wounded in Burma, and reports state that he was captured by Vichy Forces.

**L. CPL. J. BLENDOWE**, 25, wounded in action, is eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. P. Blendowe, Lancefield. He was educated at Scotch College and Dockie Agricultural College. He enlisted 12 months ago in New Guinea, where he was managing plantations for Burns, Philp, and Co.

**CPL. F. D. CHAMBERS**, missing, is son of Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Chambers, Parkington st., Kew. He was with Footscray Engineers in Adelaide and at Plant No. 1 before joining AIF, and took part in Libyan, Greek, and Cyrena campaigns. **CPL. A. T. CHAMBERS**, a brother, is in Darwin.

**CPL. J. A. FENWICK**, previously reported missing since May 3, is now reported believed prisoner of war. He was educated at Mombula and Scotch College, and was a member of Traralgon Football Club. Before enlisting in June, 1940, he was employed by Mr. L. A. Walker, accountant, Collins st.

**CPL. LEWIS GAZZARD**, 28, previously reported missing, now reported believed killed, was born at Lismore. He was a teacher at Chubb, Strathbogie, and Condah schools before enlistment.

**PTE. W. ALLAN LEES**, twin son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Lees, Lisleton, Roch ster, previously reported missing, rejoined unit, is now reported wounded in action on June 17, and believed prisoner of war. He enlisted soon after outbreak of war and served in Libya, Greece, and Crete.

**PTE. K. MACNEE**, previously reported missing, now listed prisoner of war, is son of Mr. and Mrs. MacNee, Chittalong via Traralgon.

**MAJ. E. R. MEACHER**, reported wounded in action, left Australia in April, 1941. He was an officer of the Brunswick Council, and was in charge of Brunswick centenary celebrations in August, 1939.

**PTE. S. E. MOORE**, killed in action, enlisted in May 1940. He was employed in Parkside Shoe Co., Abbotsford, and was educated at Lithgow street State school. He was the only son of Mrs. E. Mather, of Northcote, and leaves a widow and 2 children.

**PTE. MAX WHEELER**, 26, recently reported missing, has now been reported killed in action on June 17. Pte. Wheeler was former goal-kicking champion of the Ballarat Football League and leading Ballarat club player for several seasons. He was also a noted tennis player and golfer. Pte. Wheeler has left a widow and 2 children. His father, Mr. H. J. Wheeler, of Ballarat Shire, served in the last war.
